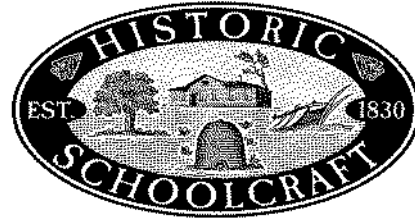

Schoolcraft Police Department

When a winter storm strikes, do not drive unless necessary.

- Be aware of and obey all travel restrictions that may be in place in your area.
- If you must travel, make sure your vehicle is stocked with survival gear such as:
 - Blankets
 - Shovel
 - Flashlight and extra batteries
 - Extra warm clothing
 - Set of tire chains
 - Battery booster cables
 - Quick energy foods
 - Brightly-colored cloth to use as a distress flag
- Keep your gas tank full to prevent gasoline freeze-up.
- If you have a cell phone or two-way radio available for your use, keep the battery charged and keep it with you whenever traveling. If you should become stranded, you will be able to call for help, advising rescuers of your location.
- Always make sure that someone knows your travel plans.

Drive Safely

The leading cause of death and injuries during winter storms is transportation accidents. Before getting behind the wheel this winter season, follow these tips to keep you and your family safe while traveling:

- Keep vehicles clear of ice and snow. Good vision is a key to good driving.
- Plan your stops and keep more distance between cars.
- Be extra alert. Remember, snowdrifts can hide smaller children.
- Always match your speed to the road and weather conditions.

Trapped in a Car

Here are some tips to follow should a blizzard trap you on the road:

- Stay in your car and wait for help to find you.
- Run your engine for short periods of time to stay warm. Keep your down-wind window open and make sure your exhaust pipe is clear of snow.
- Turn on the dome light at night when you are running the engine to signal rescuers.
- Hang a brightly colored piece of cloth or piece of clothing from your car.
- Exercise from time to time by vigorously moving arms, legs, fingers and toes to keep blood circulating and to keep warm.

HOUSEHOLD RECYCLING

Village of Schoolcraft offers *Household Recycling* to Village Residents on the fourth Wednesday of each month. This widely used program benefits our residents and helps to support our environment through the proper disposal of recyclable materials.

Businesses who wish to recycle may take their recyclables to the Best Way Transfer Station located at 2606 Miller Road between the hours of 8-5 Monday through Friday, and Saturday between the hours of 8 am to noon.

This service is *free of charge* and is for recyclable materials only. You may contact Brandy at Best Way at 269-388-3300 for additional information.

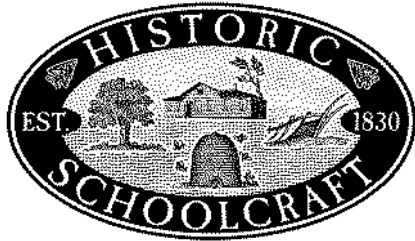
Emergency Outdoor Warning

The Village of Schoolcraft has just completed installation of a Federal 2001 Emergency System. This remote controlled, state of the art system is a high power rotating siren, and will provide maximum coverage for the Village of Schoolcraft.

The siren will be tested on the first Saturday of each month at 1:00 p.m. During the test, you will hear the siren for one continuous minute.

In an actual emergency, the siren will sound for three continuous minutes. The siren will NOT sound an all clear sound.

Schoolcraft Schools Are On The Move

In an effort to reduce both cost and carbon footprint, Schoolcraft Schools is exploring greater energy efficiency and wind power. An Energy Consortium made up of several Kalamazoo County schools (Portage, Climax-Scotts, Galesburg-Augusta, KRESA and Schoolcraft) will be meeting with business partner, Energy Education, to learn ways to reduce energy usage. In concert with this mission, the district is also investigating the feasibility of installing a wind turbine as a source of electrical power. Much research related to proper siting, wind assessment, and return on investment is needed to determine the project's viability.
